Muller House - The Problem

Muller House is a Grade II listed building in Bristol. It was 1 of 5 new orphan houses established on the site at Ashley Down between 1849 and 1870 by George Muller.

At their peak the orphanages would house over 2,000 children and it is estimated that over 18,000 children passed through their doors in total.

As part of an £8m redevelopment project, Muller House was to be converted into 66 prestigious 2 and 3 bedroom apartments. During the conversion, timbers were identified that appeared to be suffering from wood boring beetle infestation and Protectahome were approached to provide a full investigation and guaranteed remedial solution.

















Muller House - The Solution

Following a detailed inspection of the stone built structure, Protectahome's specialist CSRT qualified surveyor prepared a strategy appropriate to the problem being experienced and sympathetic to the structure.
